OUR NEXT MEETING: All are welcome. Admission is free. On Monday, October 18, 2010, at 7:00 PM, the

Haddon Heights Historical Society will host an illustrated talk by Steve Dorsey on the various trees that grace the streets of Haddon Heights and how curb-side tree-planting has evolved since the town's founding in the early 20th century. The visual aids accompanying Steve's talk are numerous photos from the new Haddon Heights Shade Tree Commission upcoming booklet, *A Walker's Arboretum*.

Mr. Dorsey is a NJ state-certified arborist and a long-standing member of the Haddon Heights Shade Tree Commission. The aforementioned booklet was an idea Steve proposed to the Commission last year to foster interest in and awareness of the many benefits of tree-lined streets, the first of what is now envisioned as a yearly series of booklets focusing on Haddon Heights trees. This booklet will be issued this fall.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE. Can you believe it is Autumn so soon?!? Have you noticed that the trees' foliage has started to turn colors already? And trees will be on our minds as we gather for the October meeting on the 18th at 7pm. Arborist Steve Dorsey will share the story of Heights' beautiful street trees that make our town so special. Steve will also discuss the Shade Commission's forthcoming publication on Heights' "Walking Arboretum." It will be an interesting evening!

Meanwhile, we just installed the two interpretive historical signs in the County Park; one by the Canons and one at the Dell, highlighting the history of the Haddon Heights Lake and the Glover Fulling Mill respectively. Dedication of the signs was just a small part of the Borough's Revolutionary War Encampment on October 9th, which also included numerous soldiers with fire arms and Historical Society member Rose Fitzgerald leading
