Our presentation is entitled, "The Battle of Gettysburg: Cultural Errors of the Army of Northern Virginia". A provocative look at a culture of relationships and therefore relationship management disguised as leadership in the Army of Northern Virginia as well as the Confederate States of America.

Col. Don Carey looks at five incidents during this momentous battle and judges why Gen. Robert E. Lee could not win.... with no reference to the industrial might, railroad miles, depth of population, quality of roads and other military concepts put forward by German-



Prussian General and military theorist Carl Philipp Gottfried von Clausewitz. Colonel Carey, USMC, had a 30 year career on active and reserve duty; a pilot on active duty and a artillery officer serving primarily with 3rd Battalion 14 Marine Regiment with batteries in Richmond, Reading, Trenton and Philadelphia. He says he held the best job in any army in the world for 3 years, that of battalion commander. He and his wife Fran have two grown children and reside in Haddonfield.

HISTORICAL SOCIETY GIFT TO SUPPORT THE TRAIN STATION. Late in 2012, the Haddon Heights Historical Society, in keeping with our mission of Community Education, Service and remembering the past for the people of tomorrow, committed a total of \$5,000 to the Delaware and Susquehanna Model Railroad Club in a "performance based" grant. This group has a long-term lease from AM-TRAK to use the Haddon Heights passenger railroad station. There are a number of aspects of the building which need immediate attention. The Model Railroad Club has received approval from the Haddon Heights Planning/Zoning Commission to proceed with structural improvements. Distribution of the Historical Society grant will be based on satisfactory documentation of completion of projects as agreed with the Club.

<u>THREE MORE HISTORICAL INTERPRETIVE MARKERS DEDICATED</u> On April 28th, The Haddon Heights Historical Society joined with owners of three of our four Pre-Revolutionary War homes in dedicating historical interpretive markers. The homes depicted are: Thorne-Glover Plantation House (c.1702)at 1908 New Jersey Ave., the John Thorne Glover house at 1212 Sylvan Ave., and the Colonel Joseph Ellis House (c.1720) located at 1009 Sycamore. Please make it a point to stop by and read these markers when you are in the neighborhood. Our next marker covering slavery in our area is being researched.
